SECOND ANNUAL RUN FOR THE HILLS A RUNAWAY SUCCESS

(Belfast)--On September 11, 69 competitive runners and 27 walkers/fun runners hit the streets to participate in Coastal Mountains Land Trust's second annual Run for the Hills. The dual event, featuring a 10K road race and a 5K, untimed walk/ fun run, finished at the east end of the Footbridge just below Harbor Hill. The 10K competitors raced on a hilly but scenic route that passed three preserves that are part of the Land Trust's Passagassawakeag Greenway.

The road race was won by Ryan Leighton, 24, of Trevett, who finished in a time of 38:33. Prize to the individual who raised the most money in sponsorships went to Cloe Chunn. Team winner was Bank of
